


#### June Meeting Information by Ed Koehler



#### Long Island Rail Road News by Steve Quigley

Major construction is complete on the East Side Access megaproject which will link the LIRR directly with Grand Central Terminal. NY State Governor Andrew Cuomo GUARANTEED on May 27<sup>th</sup> that the station will be open to LIRR trains by its December 2022 target date. When complete, the LIRR will have two stations in Manhattan, one on the West Side [Penn Station] and one in the East Side. [Grand Central] The estimated final cost will be \$11.1 Billion. The project entailed eight miles of new tunnels and the construction of a nine block long station that is three stories below street level.

There will be a 350,000 sq. ft. concourse with white marble walls, archways and storefronts which will contain an estimated 25 retailers. It is possible that commuters who use the East Side Access to Grand Central may save up to 40 minutes on their daily ride if they work on the East Side of Manhattan.

Construction of the Project began in 2006 with an estimated completion date of 2011. The Project was originally expected to cost an estimated \$4+- billion.

Harold Interlocking, which is an incredibly busy rail junction of Amtrak and LIRR trains, underwent \$1 Billion in upgrades. The remaining work on the project entails the installation of various electrical and communication technology such as signal systems. It is planned that test trains will be running through the tunnel this summer.

[I would like to be on one of the first regularly scheduled LIRR trains going into ESA. It will be History in the Making! SQ]

There has been mention that as a result of LIRR trains going into Grand Central, Metro-North will be running trains into Penn Station. Terms of the agreement and further information are still in the early stages.

LIRR timetables which have been printed in various versions since the 1830's will not be printed any longer. This is due to various reasons which include cost cutting as well as the fact that the LIRR schedules have changed many times in the past year.

As a result of the above, LIST is in the process of publishing a commemorative book on the history of LIRR timetable/schedules. The book is in the early stages so if you would like to contribute to any aspect of this book, your assistance would be appreciated. Among other things, we are looking for old timetables to copy and show in the book. All items will be returned to the owner. The book will be published by LIST.

Thanks to our friends at the LIRR, we were able to obtain copies of the last timetable that the LIRR has printed. This is the big foldout Branch Line timetable which lists all of the stations on a particular branch. If you wish to obtain a set of timetables of all 11 Branches of the LIRR, please send a check for \$8 to our PO Box. THE TIMETABLES ARE FREE, the \$8 is the cost of the Priority Mail shipping via the USPS. Just include a note stating that you would like a set of timetables in the envelope with your check. If you wish just ONE particular branch, call me or send a note or email and I will send it to you for free. [More than one Branch in an envelope is over one ounce which results in a substantially higher postage cost.]

#### THE LIRR MODELER by Mike Boland

### This Month's Feature: PRR P70 COACHES ON THE LIRR AND SOME FINE NEW DECALS

Well, I've reached the "halfway" point for another year of the LIRR Modeler. What a fitting way to end my feature until the fall than by writing about two interesting subjects on the LIRR: what trains ran on the Long Island with PRR P70 coaches and news about some new LIRR decals.

First, let me write about P70 coaches. These PRR coaches were used on a number of LIRR trains, according to a July 14, 1929 memo issued by the PRR.

Here are the trains using PRR P70s:

- -Train #4 to Montauk had two P70's.
- -Train #8 had three P70's.
- -Train #20 had five P70's Monday through Thursday with three P70's for Montauk and two for Greenport.
- -Train #212 to Greenport, a Friday-only train, had three P70's.
- -Train #12 ran with five P70's.
- -Train #25, westbound, ran with two P70's.
- -Train #3 ran with two or three P70's.
- -Train #4215 had an unknown number of P70's.

As an added note, all these trains ran with mail cars, parlor-buffet-lounge cars and some trains had PB70 combines.

Next, I need to write about a new line of decals that has come out by K4 Decals. K4 has four Long Island Rail Road decals available in multiple scales. How great! I've ordered the LIRR decals but at the time of this writing I do not have them. The LIRR decals offered are a 37-foot wood boxcar in white; headend, reefer and passenger car lettering in Gold; caboose decals in blue and white; and a fabulous passenger car set in white that has modernization decals and the small letters "F" and "CD" for MU cars. K4 Decals realizes that he has to color-correct some caboose lettering as they are printed blue and need to be black or a dark gray; he'll correct this in the future. These are great sets that all LIRR modelers can use no matter what scale!


